The elimination of Rock Bass and said that it had been suggested that the Association build a weir to hold Muskie fingerlings in until they were large enough to take care of themselves. He was asked to get more information as to the method and cost of such a venture.

Annual Meeting - Aug. 17<sup>th</sup> - 1963

The Annual meeting of the Baptiste Cottagers and Resorts Owners Association was held at Birch Cliff Lodge.  
Aug 17/63.

The meeting was called to order by the President Mr G. L. Bill Biggs at which time he welcomed the members and spoke about the increase in membership and the accomplishments during the past year.

(\*) The President reads correspondence received from M. F. L. Delavigne, also from Robert J. Code, Surveyor General in connection with the lake level of Baptiste Lake. A far & lengthy description from many in attendance. Mr Taylor, Dist Forester, spoke at some length re water level, after being asked who controlled the logs at the Dam, he admitted that his Department controlled the logs at request of the Bancroft Hydro Com.

It was very apparent that the membership as a whole was most interested in the water level. At the conclusion of Mr Taylor's remarks, the President called for a vote requesting that the lake level be maintained at 1,5 ft level during summer months. The vote was unanimously approved.

Mr Young advised that he attended a meeting of Town Council regarding construction of road in front of snack bar but received no satisfaction also spoke in connection with the position of Dock located on concession line.

A letter from Mr R.L. Ramslton to Mr Cannings regarding a pen for Muskie fry, and states that this project would be highly impractical. Apparently muskie are most gomphoblastic when they develop from the egg stage and so cannot be confined. Unlike trout they cannot be reared for a period of time before being released. They cannot be reared in Pond area without a ponderance of live fish (Minnows) for food.

Muskie stock is produced at the Department's Deer Lake Hatchery in the Lendray Forest District, and are usually stocked in late June. This year we plan to scatter 20,000 odd fry we have allocated

This was the same letter read to our members at our annual Meeting held at Bird Cliff Lodge Aug 17/63.

The Reeve or any member from Council made any further remarks.

At the conclusion of our meeting the Reeve agreed to look into the matter further and promised

to write our President at his home address within a period of one week.

No further discussion took place. Meeting broke up about 10 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by the President Mr. G. L. Bill Biggs at which time he welcomed the members, also a welcome for Rev. Mr. Frank Lever.

Mr. Biggs, the president after addressing a few words of welcome to the members, called the meeting to order at 2:15 p.m. There were approximately 65 members present.

The secretary, Mrs. Jean then read the minutes of the last annual meeting, held on August 17/63, and also of an emergency meeting held with the officials of Bancroft on Aug. 22, 1963. with regards to the water levels. There being no changes or corrections to the minutes, the same were duly accepted as read.

\* Mr. Biggs then reported on the steps that had been taken during the past year concerning the abnormally low water levels which had prevailed at the lake during the past few summers.

This included a report of the meeting and negotiations with the Bancroft officials in an attempt to get their co-operation in conserving the lake water. He also read a letter, dated July 31/1964 which he had sent to the Bancroft Public Utility Commission reminding them off their promise made in Sept 1963 to co-operate with us. in the maintenance of proper water levels, pointing out that the lake is again at a dangerously low level, and requesting that they take all steps within their power to conserve the lake water for the remainder of this season.

After, a further discussion of this serious problem, upon motion made by Mr. Hynes, seconded by Mr. Ross, and carried, the president and the executive council were authorized to obtain a copy of the alleged agreement between the Dept. of Lands and Forest the Village of Bancroft, made in 1911, which supposedly authorized Bancroft to draw down water from the lake for their hydro plant, and if necessary, to retain an attorney on behalf of the association, to determine whether the agreement was still valid, and if so, to request that the Dept. of Lands and Forests review the whole matter in the light of the changes that have occurred in the last half century, and to ascertain what legal rights the association and its members had in the matter, and if advisable, to take steps to enforce such rights if they exist.



Mr. Gernain, then rendered a report of the proposed sale by Herschel Township of the former C.N.R. right of way in the vicinity of the two community docks and the area presently used for parking cars.

Mr. Biggs introduced Mr. Frank Peever, of Herschel Township, who had been invited to attend the meeting to explain to the members the plans of the Township with regards to that area. Mr. Peever then stated that the Township does have certain plans

plans for replacing some of the public facilities that will be lost by the sale of the C.N.R right of way and he requested that the association send a delegation to the Township Council meeting to be held on Thursday evening, August 13<sup>th</sup>, for a full discussion of the Township plans in that regard. The president indicated such a delegation would be sent.

Mr Lawson Hall requested that the Township be asked by our delegation not to dispose of the present public facilities before the new ones are completed. This was put in the form of a motion by Mr Lloyd Nurse was seconded & carried.

Mr Peever also stated that the Township Council is in the process of acquiring a garbage disposal area. This was in a response to a resolution adopted by the association last year.

(\*) Mr Art Nickoll reported that there were no dead game fish found in Mud Creek either this past winter or the winter before. He attributed this to the fact that the water levels had been kept higher the past two winters.

Mr Reg Lanning made a motion that we ask the Dept of Lands & Forest to put more muskies fingerlings into the lake.

in order to reduce the rock bass population. This motion was seconded by Mr Bill Holford, and carried.

Mr Reg Lanning also reported that he had, on behalf of our Association, attended the first meeting of ~~The~~ Ontario Federation of Cottage Owners Associations. There were 62 cottage owners associations represented at this meeting.

The principal aims of this Federation are to represent and further the interests of cottage owners in the Provincial Parliament. After discussion it was decided that this association merited our support, and that we continue our membership in it.

Mr Biggs then announced that our treasurer Mrs Caroline Grew, had recently undergone surgery, and was not able to be present at the meeting. She had asked Mr Biggs to read her report for this year. Mr Biggs then read the treasurer's report, which was filed with the records of the association. Upon motion made by Mrs Dawson Hall seconded by Mr Peter Poole, & carried the treasurer's report was accepted as read.

Mr Biggs then stated that the nominating committee consisting of himself Mr Irving Germain, Mr D M Ross & Mrs Reg Lanning, had made the following nominations for officers of the association for the ensuing year:

Mr. Murphy was in the chair. Those present included Mr. Irving Lemire, Vice-President, Mrs. Marge Mc Gibbon, - Treasurer, and Mrs. Ethie Dennison, Secretary.

Among the matters to be discussed were the Agenda for the General Meeting to be held Saturday, August 14-1965 in the Recreation Hall at Birch Cliff Lodge.

Notice of Annual Meeting to be posted in and around lake one week prior to general meeting. Mr. Morawetz will make stencil of notice, (approx. 200 of each) and distribution will be handled by boys who deliver papers in the area.

Content of notice as follows.

"The annual meeting of the Baptiste Cottagers and Resort Owners Association will be held on Saturday, August 14, 1965 at 3 p.m., in the Recreation Hall at Birch Cliff Lodge.

Among the matters to be discussed are the following: 1 - Changes in the Constitution.

1-A. Article #4 - "The Annual Membership fee for Cottage owners shall be \$2.00, and for Resort and Camp owners \$5.00.

1-B. Article 6F. - shall read as follows: "The Treasurer shall receive, keep and disburse the funds of the Association. All disbursements shall be made by cheque. Minutes of Annual Meeting held August 14, 1965  
at Bush Cliff Lodge.

The Annual Meeting of the Baptiste Cottages and Resort Owners Association took place August 14-1965 in the Recreation Hall at Bush Cliff Lodge.

Mr. Murphy, President called the meeting to order at 2:30 p.m. There were approximately 19 members present.

After addressing a few words of welcome Mr. Murphy called on each member to stand and identify themselves.

The secretary, Mrs. Dennison read the minutes of the previous annual meeting held ~~on~~ August 8-1964. There being no changes or corrections to the minutes Mr. McClelland moved they be adopted as read. Seconded by Mr. Ross. Carried.

Mr. German reported on the sale of Association dock, to the effect that Mr. Tom Young purchased community dock for \$301.<sup>00</sup> The Association agreed to turn over \$301.<sup>00</sup> to Hershel Twp. to help defray expenses for new dock and parking facilities.

Mr. German moved that the membership approve, ratify and confirm the sale of cement and old dock by Mr. Young in the sum of \$301.<sup>00</sup> which is to be used by the township to defray expenses of new dock, boat and parking facilities.

Seconded by Mr. McClelland. Carried.

(\*) A report on the water level situation was given by Mr. Murphy.

Mr. Murphy read several letters that he had received in answer to his letter of inquiry regarding a solution to low-water levels. Letters were sent to Mr. Kelso Roberts, Surveyor General-Robt Coast, and Mr. Frank Deligne.

④ On Dec. 29/64 information was received that a new dam with several gates was proposed.

On Feb 10/65 - Mr. Pott Cook telephoned Mr. Murphy to reveal new dam had been passed and approved, and that there should be no reason for delay.

After many reports, recommendation and tests, water still was at a low level.

On Jan 27 - Notice of new dam with 3 sluiceways - to be started within 2 years.

On Mar 5/65 - Reconstruction of new dam.

Until bridge is completed in 3 months (commencing Aug 1/65) there will be some leakage between logs.

The new dam is expected to be constructed in the fall of 1965.

Motion:- Mr. Germain moved that Mr. Murphy be given a vote of thanks for the tremendous amount of work and time he has spent on this project and particularly with regard to his handling of the water level situation.

Seconded - Reg Canning - Carried.  
Motion - Mr. MacLellan moved that Mr. Murphy be given executive power to consult legal advice if he feels it becomes necessary.

Amendments to Constitution:

A motion to amend the Constitution (Article 47) reading "The annual membership fee shall be '\$2.00" to read "the annual membership of the cottage owners shall be '\$1.00 and for Resort and Camp owners - '\$5.00." was defeated by a vote of 6-4.

The Amendment to Article 6-F of the Constitution shall read as follows: The Treasurer shall receive, keep and disburse the funds of the Association. All disbursements shall be made by cheque. The President or Treasurer shall be authorized to sign cheques in sums up to \$20.00. Any cheques over \$20.00 shall be signed by the President and the Treasurer. Said Treasurer shall, from time to time make reports of the Finances of the Association to the Executive Council, and at the annual meeting. Amendment passed unanimously.

Re-stocking of fish. Reg Canning sent letter to Dept. of Lands & Forests - Fish & Game Dept. - May 12/65 - requesting that the department assist in stocking Lake Baptiste with either pike or maskinonge, and regularly and to endeavour to work out some long range plan to reduce the great numbers of rock bass in the lake.

A letter dated July 30 was received by Mr. Canning from Mr. J. M. Taylor, District Forester, at Tweed, stating that 1000 fingerlings from the Deer Lake Hatchery at Cordova Mine would be put into Baptiste Lake in July of 1965.

A further letter from Tweed, dated Aug. 3/65, confirmed the fact that on July 27 1965 - 1,500 maskinonge fingerlings 4 to 5 ins. long were planted in Baptiste Lake.

A recommendation was made to Reg Canning that he find out from the authorities the spawning term of Rock Bass.

Mr. Murphy expressed his thanks to

Reg Corning on behalf of the Association  
for his efforts in this matter.

The Treasurer's report was read by  
Mrs Ma Gibbon. She reported a balance  
on hand of \$903.33.

A motion was made by Mr. McClelland  
and seconded by Mrs Barbara Stoker that the  
Treasurer's report be accepted as read. Carried.

or Baptiste Lake on Aug. 1, 1965. Reg Corning  
submitted a financial report to the treasurer,
